The Tempest

Creative Writing: Prospero's Island

There are several ways that Prospero's island from *The Tempest* has been represented in films and performances. Before starting this creative writing activity, have the students do some research and look at pictures to help them with this task.

Creating the Island

In groups, using scrap paper and coloured marker pens, have the students create Prospero's island by writing words/descriptions on the pieces of paper and then placing them around the room. Possible suggestions:

- a soft, golden, sandy beach
- tall palm trees swaying gently in the breeze
- a dark, empty cave with scary echoing sounds

Eventually, each group will have created a carpet of words which describes their island.

Exploring the Island

Next, have students take each other on a tour of their island that they have created describing everything that they can see, hear, feel and smell. This can then lead to pupils writing a description of their island in as much detail as possible. They could describe their favourite place or a dangerous place on the island.

Example

I step out of the boat and my feet touch the warm, soft sand that gets between my toes as I walk. As I look around I see trees taller than houses. The tree trunks are as smooth as their large, green leaves. The leaves spread out like fans. As I look around I see colorful birds fly over the treetops into the blue sky. I feel the heat from the sun and it makes me smile. I think I will like it here...

Further suggestion: In Art, students can create a collage of Prospero's island.
